



# Indiana County Fair

## Scholarship Program Information

\*\*Applicants may apply for both Clayton Winebark Livestock and Don White Dairy Scholarships, but may only receive 1(one) of the scholarships 1 (one) time only.

\*\*Applications materials will not be returned and will become property of the Indiana Count Fair.

\*\*\*Applicants who do not receive a scholarship are encouraged to apply in subsequent years.

**\*\*\*Applicants must abide by the rules page associated with their submitted Scholarship.**

\*\*Students must obtain a minimum 2.0 GPA

\*\*Applications postmarked after the 3<sup>rd</sup> (third) Saturday in June before the fair will not be considered.

\*\*Each applicant must have completed their senior year of high school and be enrolled in an accredited post-secondary educational institution.

\*\*The scholarship program will be under the direction of the Indiana County Fair Board.

\*\*All scholarship monies will be kept in separate accounts.

\*\*All money marked from the sale or in any other form of donations will be deposited into the accounts to keep the program active.

\*\*Scholarship recipient will be determined by the scholarship committee of the Indiana County Fair Board.

\*\*Scholarship monies will be determined by the amount of funds available so the program may continue for future years.

**\*\*\*Students must complete an application and a statement of approximately 300 words explaining how the Indiana County Fair has helped them to achieve goals, objectives and career choices.**

# Clayton Winebark Livestock Scholarship Program

## Who is Eligible

Each applicant must have completed their senior year of high school, must be showing and selling Livestock (beef, swine, lambs, or goats) at the Indiana County Fair and must verify that he/she is enrolled in an accredited post-secondary educational institution.

## How to Apply

**Student must complete an application and a statement of approximately 300 words explaining how the Indiana County Fair has helped them to achieve goals, objectives and career choices.**

In evaluating the applications, preference will be given to those demonstrating need, desire, and initiative, as well as to those who have participated in showing at the Indiana County Fair for more than 1 (one) year. Each applicant may be subject to a personal interview by the scholarship committee, if needed.

## Application Deadline

Applications postmarked after the **3<sup>rd</sup> (third) Saturday in June** before the Fair will not be considered.

## Announcement of Awards

Applicants will be notified by mail and the names of the successful applicants will be announced the evening of the livestock auction. Recipient must be present or have an approved representative to receive scholarship.

## Payment of Award

Evidence of satisfactory completion of a semester's course including a transcript of final grades is required prior to payment of the award. **Deadline for receiving documentation is May 31 following the Fair.** Failure to comply will result in forfeiture. Students must obtain a minimum **2.0 GPA**.
